

Stockton's Kramer Hall to Host Book Reading, Discussion of the Lives of Casino Employees

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Galloway Township, NJ – Take a personal look at the experiences of present-day casino employees during a reading and discussion of “Just One More Hand: Life in the Casino Economy” at Stockton University’s Kramer Hall instructional site in Hammonton on **Tuesday, April 14.**

“Just One More Hand” was written by Ellen Mutari, Stockton professor of Economics and Deborah M. Figart, Stockton professor of Education and Economics. The book explores the impact the current casino industry has on its employees. This is done by telling the stories of real employees and how the changing casino industry has made their jobs less stable, leading to more difficulties with their livelihoods than previously.

Additionally, the book discusses how the construction of casinos outside Atlantic City has affected the industry.
